**Tura, Jan. 25:** The Garo hills administration today sent out a strong message to the electorate on 7th National Voters' Day.

"Voting is a powerful medium of expression, which has been conferred upon the electorate," said Pravin Bakshi, the deputy commissioner of West Garo Hills, during a celebration here today.

Bakshi said Meghalaya holds the record for the second-highest voting percentage in the country, coming second only to Tripura's 93 per cent turnout. He also asked the newly enrolled voters to vote wisely for a stronger democracy.
